Orange Sky is the world's first free mobile laundry service for people experiencing homelessness – an idea founded in the garage of two 20-year-old mates, Nic Marchesi and Lucas Patchett. In late 2014, the boys installed a couple of washing machines and dryers in the back of their old van and visited parks around Brisbane, Australia to wash and dry clothes for free. What started as an idea to improve hygiene standards and restore dignity to people doing it tough has evolved into something much bigger and more powerful.

Make Your Own Sudsy Van



Sudsy was our very first van and now you can make your very own! Young kids may need a little help with this one.

Some fun Sudsy facts

- Each of our laundry vans have two washing machines and two dryers!
- There are now 33 vans just like Sudsy that operate in Australia and New Zealand providing tonnes of fresh clean loads of laundry every week!

How to make it

You'll need

- One A4 sheet of white paper
- Colouring in pencils or pens
- Safety scissors
- Glue suitable for paper

Steps

- Print off the Sudsy van template on the next page on an A4 piece of paper.
- 2 Colour in your Sudsy van!
- 3 Using scissors, carefully cut along the solid lines on the outside of the van – make sure not to cut off the little triangle tabs (indicated by dots).
- 4 Fold down the four sides of the van creating its shape, and then fold along the connecting line of each of the triangular connector tabs.
- 5 Using glue, paste the folded triangular tabs to connect the four sides of the van!
- 6 Display your Sudsy van with pride and always share what Sudsy and the fleet of Orange Sky vans do.

Orange Sky Washing Line

Start conversations with an Orange Sky washing line. Cut out the shapes, colour them in and hang your washing line up to spark a conversation!

While Orange Sky provides a laundry and shower service, it's the connection and conversations that happen on our shifts that have the greatest impact. We hope your washing line can start some conversations!

How to make it

You'll need

- One or more sheets of A4 paper
- Colouring in pencils or pens
- Safety scissors
- 1.5 metres of ribbon or string
- Sticky tape or pegs

Steps

- Print the Orange Sky Washing Line template on the next page on a sheet of A4 paper.
- 2 Colour in the Orange Sky shapes from the template.
- 3 Carefully cut out each shape following the solid outlines on the template.
- 4 'Spacing your out shapes' evenly, carefully attach them to your piece of ribbon or string using sticky tape or pegs.
- 5 Hang your amazing new Orange Sky washing line!

For extra fun or big groups

Photocopy the template page to make lots of individual washing lines, or an extra long line!

Conversation Starters



Use our conversation starter cards at the bottom of the page to get the conversations flowing at home or in the classroom to start chatting about homelessness.

People who experience homelessness are often disconnected from their community and that's why Orange Sky's mission is to positively connect communities. Every week our volunteers have almost 1,500 hours of genuine, non-judgemental conversation with people from all walks of life doing it tough.

Using our conversation starters

- Print and cut the conversation starter cards.
- 2 Discuss the rules; be kind to each other, it's okay to 'pass' if you're not sure!
- 3 Take turns to draw a conversation card and read it aloud to the group.
- 4 Discuss the question on the card.
- 5 Adults should guide the conversation where needed.
- 6 Repeat until all cards have been used!

Classroom Tip

Place cards on six random students' chairs. Ask the six students to come to the front of the classroom to read out the questions for a class discussion.

Through conversations taking place on our six orange chairs, our volunteers connect with our friends on the street through genuine and non-judgemental conversation.

We'd love your help to connect our communities. Why not write a letter of support to someone who might be experiencing homelessness?

Things to think about

- For most people, homelessness is a temporary experience and not a definitive label.
- Not all people experiencing homelessness are sleeping on the street - it's actually a small percent. The majority of friends we help are living in shelters, boarding houses, temporary accommodation or severely crowded homes.
