One Idea^o

Orange Sky is the world's first free mobile laundry service for people experiencing homelessness – an idea founded in the garage of 20-year-old Brisbane mates, Nic Marchesi and Lucas Patchett.

In 2014, the two installed a couple of washing machines and dryers in the back of their old van and visited parks around Brisbane to wash and dry clothes for free. What started as an idea to improve hygiene standards for people doing it tough has evolved into something much bigger and more powerful.

We hope your students enjoy this Activity Pack to learn more about Orange Sky, homelessness in Australia and the power of genuine connection.



Colouring In

Get out your favourite colouring in pens or pencils and colour in one of our famous Orange Sky vans! All our vans are in our favourite 'juiced' orange colour...



Did you know?

Vans like the one above are our 'hybrid' vans - they have 2 washing machines and dryers in the side door, and a shower in the backdoor!



Orange Sky Washing Line

Start conversations with an Orange Sky washing line. Cut out the shapes, colour them in and hang your washing line up to spark a conversation!

While Orange Sky provides a laundry and shower service, it's the connection and conversations that happen on our shifts that have the greatest impact. We hope your washing line can start some conversations!

How to make it

You'll need

- One or more sheets of A4 or A3 paper
- Colouring in pencils or pens
- Safety scissors
- 1.5 metres of ribbon or string
- Sticky tape or pegs

Steps




- 1 Print the Orange Sky Washing Line template on the next page on a sheet of A4 or A3 paper.
- 2 Colour in the Orange Sky shapes from the template.
- 3 Carefully cut out each shape following the solid outlines on the template.
- 4 Spacing your cut shapes evenly, carefully attach them to your piece of ribbon or string using sticky tape or pegs.
- 5 Hang your amazing new Orange Sky washing line!

Conversation Starters

Use our conversation starter cards at the bottom of the page to get the conversations flowing at home or in the classroom to start chatting about homelessness.

People who experience homelessness are often disconnected from their community and that's why Orange Sky's mission is to positively connect communities. Every week our volunteers have thousands of hours of genuine, non-judgemental conversation with people from all walks of life doing it tough.



Classroom Idea

Place cards on random students' chairs. Ask the students who find the cards to come to the front of the classroom to read out the questions for a class discussion.

Using our conversation starters

- 1 Print and cut the conversation starter cards.
- 2 Discuss the rules; be kind to each other, it's okay to 'pass' if you're not sure!
- 3 Take turns to draw a conversation card and read it aloud to the group.
- 4 Discuss the question on the card.
- 5 Adults should guide the conversation where needed.
- 6 Repeat until all cards have been used!



Things to think about...

For most people, homelessness is a temporary experience and not a definitive label.

Not all people experiencing homelessness are sleeping on the street - it's actually a small percent.

The majority of friends we help are living in shelters, boarding houses, temporary accommodation or severely crowded homes.
